Widespread 1- to 3-foot snow accumulations have piled up in parts of the Northeast, led by 42 inches in West Winfield, New York. At least one location in 15 states has seen a foot

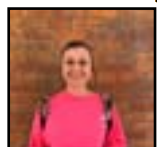
of snow from Stella in the Midwest and Northeast.

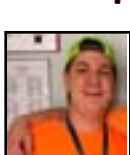

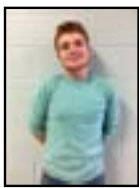
